## NEW HEBRIDES CONDOMINIUM — Maps of the Islands — Part II

The second part of the new definitive series from the Anglo-French Condominium of the New Hebrides is due for release this month. Part II comprises four stamps, 15FNH, 25FNH, 30FNH and 40FNH. The 25NFH stamp was originally planned for release with Part I on 6 September.

The designs, by Leslie Curtis, follow the same format as Part I with the maps and local items inside a keyhole outline. The 25FNH value was printed by The House of Questa and the remaining values of Part II were printed in lithography by John Waddington of Kirkstall Ltd. French and English versions of each stamp have been produced with CA watermarked paper use for the English values and unwatermarked paper for the French values.

The subjects are as follows:  
**15FNH — Espiritu Santo**

This is the largest island with three summits, including the highest summit of the archipelago. The island has lush valleys and many coconut trees. The main town is Luganville, formerly known in English as Santo. Inset is a picture of some local beef cattle which give high quality meat as a result of the fine pastures.

**25FNH — Malakula**

This is a large island with diverse cultures and some heavily populated off-shore islands. Some headdresses are illustrated in the lower portions of the design.

**30FNH — Aoba and Maewo**

Aoba is more densely populated than some of the islands and is the headquarters of the Anglican Church with the Bishop at Lolowai. Pigs are bred on this island and the inset item is a pair of curved pigs' tusks. Maewo has a waterfall and some caves.

**40FNH — Tanna and Aniwa**

Tanna is perhaps the richest island. On Tanna is 'Yasour', a volcano emerging from a bed of ashes and surrounded by a lake in the middle of lush vegetation.

The inset item is the Prophet John Frum's Red Cross. The fortified village practices cargo-cult and adores the Prophet John Frum who will bring them vast wealth. The Red Cross can be photographed but not touched and is the emblem of this religion whose origin is unknown.

## NEW HEBRIDES CONDOMINIUM

### Maps of the Islands

THE second part of the new definitive series from the Anglo-French Condominium of the New Hebrides is due for release this month. Part II comprises four stamps, 15FNH, 25FNH, 30FNH and 40FNH. The 25FNH stamp was originally planned for release with Part I on 7 September.

The designs, by Leslie Curtis, follow the same format as Part I with the maps and local items inside a keyhole outline. The 25FNH value was printed by The House of Questa and the remaining values of Part II were printed in lithography by John Waddington of Kirkstall Ltd.

French and English versions of each stamp have been produced with CA watermarked paper used for the English values and unwatermarked paper for the French values.

The subjects are as follows:

#### 15FNH — Espiritu Santo

This is the largest island with three summits including the highest summit of the archipelago. The island has lush valleys and many coconut trees. The main town is Luganville, formerly known in English as Santo. Inset is a picture of some local beef cattle which give high

quality meat as a result of the fine pastures.

#### 25FNH — Malakula

This is a large island with diverse cultures and some heavily populated off-shore islands. Some headdresses are illustrated in the lower portions of the design.

#### 30FNH — Aoba and Maewo

Aoba is more densely populated than some of the islands and is the headquarters of the Anglican Church with the Bishop at Lolowai. Pigs are bred on this island and the inset item is a pair of curved pigs tusks. Maewo has a waterfall and some caves.

#### 40FNH — Tanna and Aniwa

Tanna is perhaps the richest island. On Tanna is "Yasour", a volcano emerging from a bed of ashes and surrounded by a lake in the middle of lush vegetation.

The inset item is the Prophet John Frum's Red Cross. The fortified village practises cargo-cult and adores the Prophet John Frum, who will bring them vast wealth. The Red Cross can be photographed but not touched and is the emblem of this religion, whose origin is unknown.

Das Kondominium der Neuen Hebriden bekam jüngst eine neue Währung, den sogenannten neuen Hebriden-Franken (FNH), der den bisherigen internationalen Goldfranken (GF), die künstlich geschaffene Verrechnungseinheit des Weltpostvereins, an die sich die Neuen Hebriden anlehnten, mit Wirkung ab 1. Juli 1977 ablöste. Zunächst überdruckte man die laufende Dauerserie aus dem Jahre 1972 mit neuen Wertangaben (13 Werte: 5, 10, 15,



20, 25, 30, 35, 65 gc sowie 1-, 2-, 3-, 5-, und 10,- GF mit Überdruck 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, 50, 70, 100, 200 und 500 FNH, Ersttag 1. Juli 1977). Nunmehr erscheint in mehreren Tranchen eine neue (endgültige) Dauerserie, die die Proviso-

rien ersetzt. Die ersten fünf Werte (5, 20, 25, 50 und 100 FNH) kamen im September 1977, die vier Marken von Teil 2 (15, 30, 40 und 200 FNH) im Oktober 1977 heraus. Die Marken zeigen in Form eines Schlüssellochs Landkarten der verschiedenen Einzelinseln der Neuen Hebriden sowie eine lokale Szene bzw. heimisches Kunsthandwerk. Außerdem findet man natürlich auf jedem Wertzeichen die Symbole der beiden „Schutzmächte“ Frankreich und Großbritannien, die sich die Herrschaft über das Kondominium teilen. Um die Parität zu wahren, gibt es von jeder Marke eine französische und eine englische Version, die sich vor allem durch die Beschriftung „Nouvelles Hebrides“ bzw. „New Hebrides“ unterscheiden.



This nation released its first group of stamps in a definitive series on Sept. 7th. The entire set of twelve stamps depict various island groups of the New Hebrides while the thirteenth stamp depicts the entire archipelago. The first group consisted of five stamps; the 2nd segment, of which one of the stamps is illustrated above, was scheduled for release in October. The values will be available in both English and French versions, and will be issued in the new New Hebrides francs (FNH) instead of the previous gold franc denominations.

**October. New Currency definitives: Part II:** The 200 FNH value of the new definitives in the revised currency has been deferred for inclusion in Part II of the issue and, therefore, was not released with 5 FNH, 20 FNH, 25 FNH, 50 FNH and 100 FNH. Part II of the issue now comprises the following, the designs maps of the islands named, together with a local scene or handicraft: 15 FNH, Islands of Espiritu Santo and local cattle, 30 FNH, islands of Aoba and Maewo and drawings of boars' tusks. 40 FNH, Island of Tanna and the Prophet John Frum's Red Cross, 200 FNH, Islands of Aneityum and drawings of decorated baskets. Designer was Leslie Curtis. Printers of the 200 FNH were The House of Questa; all other values, John Waddington of Kirkstall. All are in lithography. The English set has CA watermark; the French set, no watermark.

The first part of this definitive issue was released on 7th September and not 6th September as previously announced by the Crown Agents.

The subjects and values of the four new definitives are 15f (Espirito Santo and local beef cattle), 25f (Malakula and head-dresses), 30f (Aoba and Maewo, plus curved pigs' tusks), and 40f (Tanna and Aniwa, plus Prophet John Frum's Red Cross). The designs follow the keyhole format of Part I, with the island pictured above and their local symbols in the inset. — *Crown Agents Gazette*.

## Definitive series

The New Hebrides Condominium will release the second segment of its new definitive series in October, according to the British Crown Agents. Featuring the maps of various islands plus some aspect of local history, the values will be available in both French and English versions, as is traditional. The 15-franc New Hebrides value shows the islands of Espiritu Santo and local cattle, 25frNH - Malakula and headdresses, 30frNH - Aoba and Maewo and pig tusks, and 40frNH - Tanna and the prophet John Frum's red cross. The 25frNH denomination was announced to be released on July 7 (Linn's June 13, page 14), but has been postponed. The designs are credited to Leslie Curtis.



## NEW HEBRIDES CONDOMINIUM— New Definitive Series Part I

The Anglo-French Condominium of the New Hebrides forms an irregular Y-shaped chain of twelve main and sixty smaller islands some 500 miles long in the south-western Pacific about 600 miles west of Fiji and 200 miles north-east of New Caledonia. They are of coral and volcanic formation with active volcanos on several of the islands including Ambrym, Lopevi and Tanna. Most of the islands are covered with dense forest, but there are narrow coastal strips of cultivated land. On the island Espiritu Santo, the highest peak rises to over 6,000 feet.

In September the Condominium will issue, in English and French versions, the first part of a new definitive series entitled 'Maps of the Islands'. The stamp denominations are expressed in the New Hebrides Franc and not the New Hebrides Gold Franc which has been used on recent issues and also on the last definitive series issued in July 1972. There are approximately 138 New Hebrides Francs to £1 sterling.

The designs show the maps within an outline shape similar to a keyhole. The maps occupy the top part of the 'keyhole' and a drawing of a local scene or craft item is shown beneath. The Royal Cypher and the letters 'RF' appear at the top left and right-hand corners of each stamp.

Part I comprises six stamps as follows:

### 5 FNH—Erromango.

This is a forest island with a very small population. A Kauri tree is illustrated beneath the map design.

### 20 FNH—Efate.

This is the island on which stands Port Vila, and the new Vila Post Office is shown beneath the map.

### 25 FNH—Malakula.

This is a large island with diverse cultures and some heavily populated off-shore islands. Some head-dresses are illustrated in the lower portion of the design.

### 50 FNH—Shepherd Islands.

There are three main islands in this group which is centrally situated in the chain. A drawing of a local canoe with a sail is included in the design.

### 100 FNH—Ambrym.

There are three active volcanos in this group and one volcano is shown beneath the map. In front of the volcano a slit-gong and carvings from the 15 g.c. definitive stamp are featured.

### 200 FNH—Aneityum.

The islands of Aneityum and Futuna are small but relatively important. Decorated woven baskets from Futuna are shown below the map.

The designs were prepared by Leslie Curtis and the stamps were printed by The House of Questa in lithography. CA watermarked paper was used for the English version stamps and the French version were printed on unwatermarked paper.

Part II of this series is scheduled for release next year and will comprise seven stamps, six showing maps of the islands and the seventh illustrating the whole chain of islands.

## New Hebrides Condominium New Definitive

The first part of a new definitive series is to be released on the 7 July 1977 in both French and English by the New Hebrides. Twelve stamps feature maps of the islands and the thirteenth the whole archipelago. From the history of the New Hebrides stems a French and English cultural tradition.

First sighted by Mendaña and named by James Cook, the islands were visited by almost every name famous in Pacific exploration. Neither the British nor the French wanted to annex these islands. The Australian States tried to force Britain's hand but the settlers would have preferred French dominion, as the French colonial laws were less demanding. Violence and death came to many settlers either from their rivals or from the natives, and in 1886 French troops were landed—illegally, as even the French admitted—to put a stop to the carnage. In 1887, the home governments of Britain and France signed an

agreement whereby a Joint Naval Commission was set up, presided over alternately by British and French naval commanders and charged with the protection of the lives and property of the citizens of both nations. Thus began the dual tradition of government by both the French and English.

The New Hebrides form an irregular Y-shaped chain of islands with a total land area of about 5,700 miles. Six stamps are being released designed by Mr L Curtis and printed by the lithographic process by The House of Questa. Each stamp has the same basic design: a keyhole with an island inset and a local feature. The Royal Cypher appears in one corner and RF in the opposite corner. There are two versions of each stamp, one printed in French and the other English. The English version is printed on CA watermarked paper, and the French version on unwatermarked paper.

Captain James Cook named the islands "New Hebrides" in 1774. Travelling south through many new islands, "which exhibited a most delightful prospect, being spotted with woods and lawns", the natives made signs inviting Cook and his men ashore. But they sailed on until Erromango.

At Erromango, the ship's boat went ashore with Cook, to be met by a huge multitude of natives. Cook held a green branch in one hand. The meeting began peacefully, but developed rapidly into a shoot-out. Fortunately, no serious injuries were incurred by either group.

Erromango or Erromango Island is 35 miles long by 25 miles wide in the southern part of the New Hebrides. There are several mountain ranges, with the highest point of 2600 feet above sea level. There are bays with excellent anchorages, especially Dillon Bay. The largest bay is Cook's Bay on the east coast. Located on Erromango is the Martyrs' Memorial Church wherin lies the memorial for the missionaries who died on the island.

Efate or Vate (French) Island is located in the center on the New Hebrides. It is 26 miles long by 14 miles wide. Here rests the capital of New Hebrides, Vila. This is the seat for the British-French Condominium government. Efate was formerly known as the Sandwich Island, named by Cook after the Earl of Sandwich. There are good harbors in Vila and in Havannah.

Malakula, Malekula, or Mallicolo Island is the second largest island in the New Hebrides. It is 45 miles long and 23 miles wide. The French Administrative headquarters are at Port Sandwich on the southeast coast while the British headquarters are at Bushman's Bay on the northeast coast. The highest peak is Mt. Penot at 2925 feet. Both Port Sandwich and Port Stanley are good harbors.

Shepard Islands are a small volcanic group of islands, 35 miles north of Efate. The largest island of the group is Tongoa, with the second largest, Mai. The islands were named

by Cook, after the astronomer, Dr. Anthony Shepherd of Cambridge.

Ambrym or Ambrim Island in the New Hebrides is 25 miles long and 15 miles wide. Mt. Benbow continues as an active volcano which had a disasterous eruption in 1913.

Aneityum Island is the most southerly of the New Hebrides Islands. Its central peak rises to 2788 feet. The coastal lands are fertile and there is a fine harbor on the south coast.




Regular listeners to this programme may remember that I have a favourite currency: the gold francs and gold centimes of the New Hebrides Condominium, a group of islands in the Pacific which are administered jointly by France and Britain. It has always delighted me to think that such a fair-tale coinage could actually exist, especially when I knew that the "gold" centime was worth about one twenty-fifth of 1p. I was driven to the conclusion that there was not much gold in them than centimes - or even in the francs. Now, a great change has come over the islands. They have a new currency called the New Hebrides franc which is worth about one-thirtieth of the old "gold" franc, and ten of these new francs are worth 7p. It sounds sadly as though the "gold" centime has disappeared for ever. That's another illusion shattered for no longer shall we see that coin mentioned on the stamps of the New Hebrides.

Stamp Talk by L.G.Rule

As regular listeners to this programme may remember I have for long had a special regard for the stamps issued by the New Hebrides Condominium, a group of islands in the Pacific fairly near - by Pacific standards - to Australia. The islands are administered jointly by Britain and France. For me the great charm of the stamps from the New Hebrides has always been the currency shown as the face value of the stamps which was in gold francs and gold centimes. Two or three weeks ago I reported to you that that wealthy-sounding currency was being changed to "New Hebrides francs (P.N.H.)". Now I have some further information on the subject which comes from an overprinted definitive issue and some publicity material with it. In the material the truth - which I had always feared - comes out. It seems that the gold francs and gold centimes had been used for thirty-nine years as the nominal standard coinage. The material says: "Most readers will realise that there are no gold francs in circulation in the New Hebrides or, indeed, anywhere else". In fact, they were a useful symbol for a country which had two currencies, one British and one French - and even these did not agree with each other because of changes in their values. Anyone wan-

## New Hebrides drops gold franc

Rumors became fact when the *Philatelic Bulletin* of the New Hebrides Condominium announced on May 31 that the international gold franc will be dropped from its stamps June 30.

The fluctuating price of gold and "the cumbersome nature of what should be a simple transaction" — the posting of letters — were cited as reasons for the change. Although all gold franc stamps were withdrawn from post offices on June 30, the current gold franc stamps will continue to be valid at the current rate of exchange until July 31.

Replacing the gold franc will be the New Hebrides francs (FNH) which are set, according to the announcement, at 29 FNH equals one gold franc. The changeover was scheduled for July 1 with 13 values of the 1972 definitive series surcharged in FNH. Four values from the art forms, five from the birds Charolais values, and four from the shells issue were to be surcharged.

This set of surcharged values is scheduled to be replaced with a

new definitive series of 13 stamps featuring maps of the various islands of the New Hebrides. Five stamps will be released in the first group in September.

For collectors of New Hebrides issues, this is another in a series of changes within this fascinating condominium. In 1908, two sets of stamps were first issued, one in English on Fiji stamps and the other in French on New Caledonia stamps. The British issues used shillings and pence and the French issues francs and centimes.

In 1911, the first "Idols" sets emerged with the arms of Britain on the right hand panel, the RF monogram on the left, and printed in English. The French issues bore francs and centimes with the emblem positions reversed.

When the 1925 "Idols" series was issued, both English and French stamps carried the values in both currencies. Britain's going off the gold standard in 1929 complicated matters and a solution had to be found to determine the actual value of New Hebrides stamps, although to this day, the collector has to read New Hebrides stamps

rather closely to determine if they are English or French issues!

According to the *Philatelic Bulletin*: "The method adopted was the use of the international gold franc, divided into 100 gold centimes, for both the French and English versions of stamps. The first gold franc issue was released on June 1, 1938, and this produced the unique situation whereby post office customers in the New Hebrides rendered one or the other of the official currencies in payment for stamps bearing values in a third currency."

Perhaps, too, it should be pointed out that only in the New Hebrides could this serio-comic condition be tolerated by the inhabitants; other areas would have long since voted out such a problem. Or perhaps this anachronism had its own charm for New Hebridians until the actual fluctuating value of the gold franc became intolerable.



# Keyhole view of island way of life

LAST WEEK I mentioned that The Gambia were issuing a new set of definitive stamps. The New Hebrides Condominium will be doing the same thing later. However, their subject will be based on maps of the islands and the designs take the shape of a keyhole, with the map occupying the top area and a drawing of a local scene or item beneath.

The first six stamps in the series feature the following islands: Erromango and a drawing of a kaori tree, Efate and a drawing of the new post office in Vila, Malakula and a drawing of a custom headdress, Shepherd Island and a drawing of a canoe with sail, Ambrym and a drawing of some carvings and the islands of Aneityum with a drawing of decorated baskets.

The second part of the series will be issued sometime in October and will consist of seven values.

One of the finest sets of bird stamps that I have seen for some time, have been issued by Papua, New Guinea, and they feature the pigeon

issuing the first part of their new definitive stamps in July. They are to use a variety of subjects under the general theme of natural history. The first four stamps feature a coral scene, a Madagascar fody, a fairy tern and a flying fox. A further two parts are planned for release later this year.

The inauguration of the Republic of Ireland and Tobago will be marked during July by three stamps showing the flag of Trinidad and Tobago, the coat-of-arms and government house.

A souvenir sheet incorporating the three stamps will also be released. The actual date of the inauguration of the new republic was 1st August, 1976.

The local agent of the Australian United Steam Navigation Company, Mr. W. Le Couteur was appointed Postal Agent in Vila on 1 July 1892 and was provided with a proper postal canceller, inscribed VILA/NEW HEBRIDES. Prior to this date postage stamps were either unmarked or pen-cancelled with a cross.

The A.U.S.N. Co. withdrew its steamer services at the end of 1892 and the Australian New Hebrides Company took over responsibility for the local postal service. Up until 1897 their duties were primarily concerned with external mails. Although they ran a local shipping service the inhabitants were averse to using N.S.W. stamps and the collection of local postage in cash was more trouble than it was worth. To overcome this problem the Australian New Hebrides Company issued its own postage stamps.

These stamps, in denominations of 1d and 2d, were released on 17 March 1897 and became valid for local postage from 1 May, 1897. They were designed by the prominent Australian philatelist, Mr. A. F. Basset-Hull and depicted the harbour of Port-Vila. They were lithographed in sheets of 120 by J. Sands and Co. of Sydney.

Though inscribed INTER ISLAND POSTAGE the stamps were also valid for use on mail to Sydney and their use on covers addressed to Fiji has also been recorded.

A distinctive canceller was employed, inscribed PORT - VILLA POST/ A.N.H. Co. Ltd. round the solidus with the date and NEW HEBRIDES in the centre.

The A.N.H. Company went into liquidation at the end of 1897 and their assets, including the Postal Agency, were taken over by Burns Philp & Co., who are now one of the leading commercial firms in the New Hebrides.

Postal Agencies of New Caledonia were opened in 1903 and 1905 and these agencies used New Caledonian postage stamps. The stamps of New South Wales and New Caledonia continued in use at their respective agencies until 1908. Following the establishment of the Condominium Post Office in October of that year, distinctive sets of stamps were released on 29 October, 1908, superseding the N.S.W. and New Caledonia issues. These distinctive stamps consisted of two sets in English and French, and twin series have been current simultaneously in the New Hebrides from that date. The first English set used the contemporary series of Fiji overprinted at Suva NEW HEBRIDES/CONDONIUM in denominations of 1d, 1d, 2d, 2½d 5d 6d and 1/- . The 1d, 1d, 2d and 2½d stamps were subsequently released in December 1910 with overprints applied by De La Rue; the latter overprints have the initial letters in larger capitals than the overprints done in Suva.

The French version consisted of the contemporary series of New Caledonia stamps overprinted NOUVELLES HEBRIDES in November 1908, in denominations of 5c, 10c, 25c, 50c and 1 fr. In 1910 they were released with the addition of CONDOMINIUN overprinted.

De La Rue were awarded a contract to produce distinctive definitive sets showing local artifacts in the centre, flanked by the emblems of Britain and France. These were released between July 1911 and 1912; the "sterling" series was inscribed in English with the arms of Britain in the right hand panel and the RF monogram in the left. The "centimes" series was inscribed in French with the positions of the emblems reversed. This practice has continued to the present time.

However, their subject will be based on maps of the islands and the designs take the shape of a keyhole, with the map occupying the top area and a drawing of a local scene or item beneath.

The first six stamps in the series feature the following islands: Erromango and a drawing of a kaori tree, Efate and a drawing of the new post office in Vila, Malakula and a drawing of a custom headdress, Shepherd Island and a drawing of a canoe with sail, Ambrym and a drawing of some carvings and the islands of Aneityum with a drawing of decorated baskets.

The second part of the series will be issued sometime in October and will consist of seven values.

#### NEW DEFINITIVES FOR NEW HEBRIDES

The first part of a new definitive series is due from the New Hebrides Condominium on July 7th. Printing is in lithography by The House of Questa in sheets of 25. The English version is on CA (unspecified) watermark, the French one on unwatermarked paper: 5 FNH, Erromango, and a kaori tree; 20 FNH, Efate, and a drawing of the new Post Office, Vila; 25 FNH, Malakula, and head-dresses; 50 FNH, Shepherd Is., and a canoe with sail; 100 FNH, Ambrym, and carvings; 200 FNH, Aneityum, and decorated baskets.



# THE NEW HEBRIDES CONDOMINIUM

Last month we featured Part I of a new definitive series which is planned for release in September 1977.

However, on 1 July 1977 all the values of the current definitive series were issued, overprinted and surcharged in New Hebrides Francs. The changeover coincided with the introduction of new postage rates. The unique arrangement whereby the New Hebrides Condominium used the international gold franc for its postage stamps terminated on 30 June 1977 after a period of 39 years. Most readers will realise that there are no gold francs in circulation in the New Hebrides, or indeed anywhere else. The history of the gold franc commences in 1802 when it was established under French law as the French franc. Postal and Telecommunications Administrations adopted this currency, which was then known as the Geminal franc, for their international accounting. The Universal Postal Union, which was established in 1874, also adopted the Geminal franc as the unit for international postage rates. The Geminal franc was defined as the weight of 0.290323 grammes of gold of a fineness of 0.90.

After 1914, the value of the French franc started to change in relation to gold. The Geminal franc however remained in being as the Swiss franc until 1936. Although no longer available as a national currency, Administrations retained the Geminal franc as the monetary standard for their international services, now known as the gold franc, and still continue to use it.

The reasons which led up to the use of the gold franc for New Hebrides stamps arise from the use of two currencies within the Condominium. British sterling and French francs both used to circulate but the de facto British currency is now the Australian dollar and since 1940 the official French currency has been the New Hebridean franc.

When postage stamps were first issued by the Condominium Post Office in 1908, they consisted of two sets of stamps, one in English and the other in French. The English version utilised the stamps of Fiji in denominations of shillings and pence, overprinted 'New Hebrides', whilst the French version used the contemporary series of New Caledonia francs and centimes, overprinted 'Nouvelles-Hebrides'.

A New Hebrides definitive series was produced in 1910. The shillings and pence denominations and the name of the country were inscribed in English with the arms of Great Britain on the right-hand panel and the R F monogram on the left. The francs and centimes denominations were inscribed in French on the Nouvelles Hebrides version, with the position of the emblems reversed.

The use of the two languages and the transposition of the two emblems has continued until the present day, but in 1925 a new dual currency series was issued. The English and French versions of the stamps each carried values in both currencies. The value of the stamp was printed under the French emblem in francs and centimes and under the British emblem in shillings and pence.

This issue soon ran into difficulties because of a gradual change in value between the pound and the franc. Further complications arose

when Britain went off the gold standard in 1929. As the dual currency series did not represent equivalent amounts of postage, it became necessary to seek an alternative solution to the problem of the actual value of the New Hebrides stamps.

The method adopted was the use of the international gold franc, divided into 100 gold centimes, for both the French and English versions of stamps. The first gold franc issue was released on 1 June 1938 and this produced a unique situation whereby Post Office customers in the New Hebrides tendered one or other of the official currencies in payment for stamps bearing values in a third currency. The local population learned to live with this quaint situation and accepted philosophically that posting letters could be a complicated time-consuming matter. However, the increasing business at Post Office counters, and in particular the growth of tourist traffic, has highlighted the cumbersome nature of what should be a simple transaction. There is a further complication in that the market price of gold is no longer pegged; it is not a standard any more but a commodity whose price fluctuates daily.

Posts and Telecommunications Administrations are finding that floating currencies are an added problem. Some countries have ceased to quote an exchange rate for their own currency and the gold franc and consider that it should be replaced as an accounting unit. A possible replacement is the SDR (special drawing rights) used by the IMF, which is related to the average value of a basket of sixteen major world currencies.

Now that the gold franc has lost its precision its continued use on the stamps of the New Hebrides creates more problems than those it was intended to solve. It has been decided therefore that Condominium stamps will henceforth bear values in New Hebridean francs (FNH). The overprinting was carried out by the French Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications and the stamps of the 1972 definitive series have been surcharged, to accommodate the new postal rates, as follows:

An official First Day Cover was produced for the overprinted issue and was designed to carry one of the above groups of four or five stamps. The 35 Gc. aerogramme (Concorde) was overprinted locally with a value of 15FNH.

Although all gold franc stamps were withdrawn from sale at Post Offices in the New Hebrides on 30 June 1977 they were valid for postage until 31 July 1977.

The initial issue will consist of the 1972 definitive series surcharged in FNH. The overprinting is being carried out by the French Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications in France and will consist of the following 13 values:

**Withdrawal of Gold Franc Stamps**

All gold franc stamps, including the 1972 definitive series and the Queen Elizabeth Silver Jubilee commemorative set, were withdrawn from sale at Post Offices on June 30th, 1977. However, gold franc stamps continued to be valid for the payment of postage, at the current rate of exchange, until 31st July, 1977 and were also on sale from the Philatelic Bureau in Port Vila until that date.

**New Definitive Series**

A new definitive series is in course of production. The issue will consist of a set of 13 stamps featuring maps of the various islands of the New Hebrides. The first group of five stamps is scheduled to be released in September 1977.

**Gold Franc disappears**

The unique arrangement whereby the New Hebrides Condominium used the international gold franc for its postage stamps, terminated on June 30, 1977 after a period of 39 years of use. On and after July 1, 1977 stamps of the Condominium carry values expressed in New Hebridean francs (FNH).

Since June 1, 1938 post office customers in the New Hebrides rendered one or other of the official currencies in payment for stamps bearing values in a third currency, making the act of posting letters quite complicated, and often time-consuming. Increasing business at post office counters, and the growth of tourist traffic highlighted the cumbersome nature of what should be a simple transaction.

Now that the gold franc has lost its precision (due to the fluctuating price of gold), its continued use on New Hebrides stamps created more problems than it was intended to solve. The introduction of the new system of New Hebridean francs (FNH) coincides with the introduction of new postal rates. Current rate of exchange is FNH 29 = 1 gold franc.

New Hebrides Condominium has issued a new definitive overprint series of 13 stamps in English and French. The new values are New Hebrides francs.

The stamps include four art forms, five birds and four shells which all were part of the 1972 definitive series.

They were overprinted in NHFrancs because New Hebrides ceased using the international gold franc on June 30, 1977. Meanwhile, a new definitive series, part one, has been issued. It features maps of the islands and the values range from 5FNH to 200.

### Sunday News (Detroit)

With the introduction of new postal rates on July 1, New Hebrides Condominium, after 39 years, terminated the use of the gold franc for its stamps. New issues will carry values in New Hebridean francs (FHN). The initial emission is the overprinting of the 13-value 1972 definitive series featuring art forms, birds, shells and a charolais bull.

### Stamps (USA)

**NEW HEBRIDES** — The six stamps comprising Part I of the new regular series previously announced (5, 20, 25, 50, 100, 200) for 7th July 1977 now have been postponed until sometime in September 1977. The stamps were o/p'd at the same time to provide for new postal rates and were released 1st July 1977; o/p and surcharging by the French Min. of P.T. The 35gc **Concorde aerogram** was o/p'd locally with new value of 15FNH. (Crown Agents.)

Original and surcharged values with new denominations are as follow: **Art Forms:** 5gc-5FNH; 15gc-15FNH; 1.00gf-50FNH; 3.00gf-100FNH; **Birds:** 10ge-10FNH; 20gc-20FNH; 35gc-35FNH; 2.00gf-70FNH; 10.00gf-500FNH; **Shells:** 25gc-atFNH; 30gc-30FNH; 65gc-40FNH; 5.00gf-200FNH one gold franc equals 29FNH; about 40c U.S.

The unique currency of NEW HEBRIDES is finally being replaced by the New Hebrides Franc. This changeover is the result of the fluctuating currency, since it was formerly based on the "gold franc." The "free" market in money has made it necessary since there has been a fluctuation of the value of the monies of the world.

The "floating" exchange for pounds, dollars and whatever has brought much difficulty to the postal charges of the Condominium governed by French and English. Three issues of stamps have been surcharged with the new FNH (New Hebrides Franc) and are available from the Philatelic Section, Condominium Post Office, Port-Vila, New Hebrides.

The art set is \$2.24, birds at \$8.36 and shells at \$2.21 and these are the approximate values (to be safe include a few extra cents if you order). All stamps in gold francs are not now usable for postage.

A new definitive series was released July 7 and it features maps of the islands. There are six stamps in the set and the values are five, 20, 25, 50, 100 and 200 FNH.

### Fine Arts Philatelist (USA)

**NEW HEBRIDES** 1 Jul 77/Scott 155-156, 196 now issued in new currency: 29 FNH (New Hebrides francs) = 1 (old) gold franc. (New Hebrides PO)

The unique arrangement whereby the New Hebrides Condominium has used the international gold franc for its postage stamps terminated on June 30 after 39 years. Consequently, the 13 stamps of the 1972-74 definitive series (birds, shells and traditional art forms) have been overprinted with new values in New Hebridean francs (FNH).

Of course there are no gold francs in circulation in the New Hebrides — or anywhere

else. The history of the gold franc commences in 1802 when it was established under French law as the French franc.

Postal and telecommunication administrations adopted this currency, which was then known as the Geminal franc, for their international accounting. The Universal Postal Union, established in 1874, also adopted the Geminal franc as the unit for international postage rates. The Geminal franc

was defined as the weight of 0.290323 grams of gold of a fineness of 0.90.

After 1914 the value of the French franc started to change in relation to gold. The Geminal franc, however, remained in being as the Swiss franc until 1936. Although no longer available as a national currency the Geminal franc was still retained by administrations as the monetary standard for international services. But now it became known

as the gold franc.

The use of the gold franc for New Hebridean stamps arose from the fact that two distinct currencies existed within the condominium, administered jointly by Britain and France. British sterling and French francs both used to circulate, but the de facto British currency is now the Australian dollar and since 1940 the official French currency has been the New Hebridean franc.

When postage stamps were

first issued by the Condominium Post Office in 1908 they comprised two distinct sets, one in English and the other in French. The English version utilized the stamps of Fiji with denominations in shillings and pence, overprinted New Hebrides. The French series used the contemporary stamps of New Caledonia in francs and centimes, overprinted Nouvelles-Hebrides.

A definitive New Hebrides series produced in 1910 was actually two separate sets — one printed in English with values in shillings and pence, the other in French with values in francs and centimes.

The use of the two languages continued to June 30 this year, but in 1925 a new dual currency series was issued. English and French versions of the stamps each carried values in both currencies. This ran into difficulties when a gradual change took place between the value of pounds and francs.

A problem existed and the solution was the use of international gold francs, divided into 100 gold centimes. The first gold franc issue was released in 1938 and produced the unique situation whereby Post Office customers paid in one or another of the official island currencies for stamps bearing values in a third currency.

However, the gold franc has lost its precision in recent years and its continued use on stamps has created more problems than it was intended to solve. It has been decided therefore that Condominium stamps will henceforth bear values in New Hebridean francs. The current exchange rate is 29 FNH to each gold franc.

The 1972-74 definitive issues ranged from five gold centimes to 10 gold francs. The new overprinted stamps will range from five to 200 FNH.

# Condominium stamps bear values in New Hebridean francs starting July 1

The unique arrangement whereby the New Hebrides Condominium uses the international gold franc for its postage stamps was to terminate on June 30, 1977, after a period of 39 years. On and after July 1, 1977, stamps will carry values in New Hebridean francs (FNH).

Most readers will realize that there are no gold francs in circulation in the New Hebrides, or indeed anywhere else.

The history of the gold franc commences in 1802 when it was established under French law as the French franc. Postal and telecommunication administrations adopted this currency, which was then known as the Geminal franc, for their international accounting.

The Universal Postal Union, which was established in 1874, also adopted the Geminal franc as the unit for international postage rates. The Geminal franc was defined as the weight of 0.290323 grams of gold of a fineness of 0.90.

After 1914, the value of the French franc started to change in relation to gold. The Geminal franc, however, remained in being as the Swiss franc until 1936.

Although no longer available as a national currency, administrations retained the Geminal franc as the monetary standard for their international services, now known as the gold franc, and still continue to use it.

The reasons which led to the use of the gold franc for New Hebrides stamps arose from the use of two currencies within the condominium. British sterling and French francs both used to circulate, but the de facto to British currency is now the Australian dollar and since 1940 the official

French currency has been the New Hebridean franc.

When postage stamps were first issued by the Condominium Post Office in 1908, they consisted of two sets of stamps, one in English and the other in French.

The English version utilized the stamps of Fiji in denominations of shillings and pence, overprinted "New Hebrides", while the French version used the contemporary series of New Caledonia in francs and centimes, overprinted "Nouvelles-Hebrides."

A definitive New Hebrides series was produced in 1910. The shillings and pence denominations and the name of the country were inscribed in English with the arms of Britain on the right hand panel and the RF monogram on the left. The francs and centimes denominations were inscribed in French on the Nouvelles-Hebrides version, with the position of the emblems reversed.

The use of the two languages and the transposition of the two emblems has continued until the present day, but in 1925 a new dual currency series was issued.

The English and French versions of the stamps each carried values in both currencies. The value of the stamp was printed under the French emblem in francs and centimes and under the British emblem in shillings and pence.

This issue soon ran into difficulties because of a gradual change in value between the pound and the franc. Further complications arose when Britain went off the gold standard in 1929.

As the dual currency series did not represent equivalent amounts of postage, it became necessary to seek an alternative solution to the problem of

the actual value of the New Hebrides stamps.

The method adopted was the use of international gold franc, divided into 100 gold centimes, for both the French and English versions of stamps.

The first gold franc issue was released on June 1, 1938 (Scott Type A5) and this produced the unique situation whereby post office customers in the New Hebrides rendered one or the other of the official currencies in payment for stamps bearing values in a third currency.

The local population learned to live with this quaint situation and accepted philosophically that posting letters could be a complicated and time-consuming matter. However, the increasing business at post office counters, and in particular the growth of tourist traffic, has highlighted the cumbersome nature of what should be a simple transaction.

There is a further complication in that the market price of gold is no longer pegged; it is not a standard any more, but a commodity whose price fluctuates daily.

Post and telecommunications administrations are finding that floating currencies are an added problem. Some countries have ceased to quote an exchange rate for their own currency and the gold franc, and consider that it should be replaced as an accounting unit.

A possible replacement is the SDR (special drawing rights) used by the IMF, which is related to the average value of a basket of 16 major world currencies. Now that the gold franc has lost its precision, its continued use on the stamps of the New Hebrides creates more problems than those it was in-

the actual value of the New Hebrides stamps.

(Concorde) will be overprinted locally with a value of 15 FNH.

An official first day cover has been produced for this issue. The cover is approximately 185 by 96 millimeters, and is designed to carry one group of four or five stamps (Art Forms, Birds / Charolais, or Shells). The price of serviced FDC is 10 FNH plus the face value of the stamps.

All gold franc stamps, including the 1972 definitive series and the Queen Elizabeth II Silver Jubilee commemorative set were to be withdrawn from sale at post offices on June 30. However, gold franc stamps will continue to be valid for the payment of postage, at the current rate of exchange, until July 31, 1977. They will also be on sale from the Philatelic Bureau until that date.

All orders should be addressed to

accompanied by a remittance suffi-

cient to cover return postage and reg-

istration (if required).

Postage is charged on all orders, at the airmail rates in force, but is con- sidered to have been paid whenever sufficient stamps "canceled to order" are enclosed. Remittances should be in the form of a bank draft or airmail transfer to one of the banks operating in the New Hebrides.

will be on sale from the Philatelic



**SILVER JUBILEE 1977**

Next month twenty-four countries will be releasing stamps which, although of an omnibus nature, constitute an entirely original concept of design, theme and interpretation. The traditional method of presentation of an omnibus set with stamps of common design only differing in colour, country name and value, having been rejected in favour of a completely fresh approach.

For this unique set each participating Postal Authority will issue stamps of three denominations. One of these shows a Royal connection with the country concerned; the second an item of the Coronation regalia or related subject whilst the third depicts a scene from the Coronation Ceremony arranged in an alphabetical/chronological sequence. Thus the Ascension Island highest value stamp shows Her Majesty leaving Buckingham Palace in the golden Coronation coach, that for Barbados depicts the Queen leaving the coach at Westminster Abbey and so on until, finally, the Turks & Caicos Islands' 55c. value completes the picture by illustrating the Royal Family waving to the crowd from the balcony of Buckingham Palace at the conclusion of the Ceremony. A truly splendid series of stamps showing the Coronation from beginning to end and we are pleased to be showing all the stamps in full colour in our February edition.

In producing the stamps the services of several well known stamp designers and security printers have been used.

Two features are common to all of the stamps in the omnibus set, namely the size, 48.26x31.75mm and the type of lettering. The latter was produced specifically for the occasion by Miss Jennifer Toombs FRSA NDD, and combines a high degree of clarity with a dignified appearance wholly appropriate to the event being commemorated.

With one exception the Omnibus will be released on Monday, 7 February 1977. The exception being the Pitcairn Islands who intend releasing their set on Sunday, 6 February, the actual Anniversary of the Accession.

First Day Covers will be available for all issues. The covers are a uniform size, 190x110mm, and the individual design for each Postal Authority is die-stamped on high quality, light grey, grained paper. Illustrations of some of the First Day Cover designs are to be found on page CA6.





The U.S. Bicentennial — \$2 Condominium will commemorate the 25th anniversary of the accession to the throne by Queen Elizabeth II with a trio of stamps forecast for Feb. 7, according to the Philatelic Section, Condominium Post Office, Port Vila, New Hebrides, South Pacific.

As part of the British Crown Agents' omnibus issue, the stamps of the New Hebrides join those of 24 other nations in the sequential presentation of the coronation scene.

The New Hebrides trio will be released in both an English version as well as a French version, as is traditional.

The New Hebrides' jubilee stamps are in the values of 35 and 70 gold centimes and 2 gold francs. The low-value stamp depicts Queen Elizabeth during the Royal Visit to that country in 1974. The base color is green. The Queen wears a yellow dress and carries a yellow umbrella.

The Imperial State Crown is featured on a blue background in the 70-gold centimes stamp. The gold francs stamp depicts the newly crowned Queen receiving The Blessing after she was crowned at Westminster Abbey. Background color of this stamp is coral. The three duplicate adhesives have the French language.



# Silver Jubilee Year

The Silver Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II of Great Britain will be the big philatelic event of 1977.

The British Empire is no more, and the Commonwealth of Nations is smaller than it once was, but even so nearly 50 postal administrations will issue stamps marking the Queen's 25 years as monarch.

It was on the morning of Feb. 6, 1952 that the 25-year-old Princess Elizabeth, then on tour in Kenya with her husband, Prince Philip, learned of the death of her father, King George VI, and her own accession to the throne.

As on similar occasions in the past, there will be an omnibus issue for the 25th anniversary, but this time the stamps will not be in a common design differing only in color, country name and denomination.

Twenty-four of the postal administrations represented by the Crown Agents will issue stamps of an omnibus nature, but with an entirely original concept of design, theme and interpretation.

The theme will be the Coronation pageantry of June 2, 1953 when the Queen was formally crowned by the Archbishop of Canterbury in Westminster Abbey.



For Bermuda, for example, there will be a 5c stamp showing the Queen during her visit of February 1975 observing the panoramic view from Gibb's Hill, a spot now known as "Queen's View."

A second denomination will use an item of the coronation regalia or a related subject. For Bermuda, it is a 20c stamp showing the King Edward Crown, used in every coronation since that of Charles II.

The third denomination of each set will picture a scene from the coronation pageantry arranged in chronological and alphabetical sequence. Thus the Ascension Islands 25p high value shows the Queen leaving Buckingham Palace in the golden coronation coach. Bermuda's \$1 value has her sitting her Chair of Estate in Westminster Abbey, and Turks and Caicos Islands, at the end of the line alphabetically and chronologically, has the royal family back home after the ceremony, waving to crowds from the balcony of the palace.

Two features are common to all of the stamps in the omnibus set. All are the same size, 48.26 by 31.75, and all use the same style of lettering, developed especially for the series by Jennifer Toombs. There are 13 different design credits, and four security presses printed the stamps. All are lithographed.

Twenty-three of the administrations serviced by the Crown Agents and their American agent, StanGib, Ltd., will issue their sets on Monday, Feb. 7: Ascension Islands, Barbados, Belize, Bermuda, Botswana, British Antarctic Territory, British Virgin Islands, Cayman Islands, Falkland Islands, Fiji, The Gambia, Gilbert Islands, Hong Kong, Mauritius, Montserrat, New Hebrides Condominium (sets in both English and French), St. Helena, St. Kitts, Solomon Islands, South Georgia, Swazi-


Pitcairn Islands will issue theirs on Sunday, Feb. 6, the actual anniversary date.

An American agency, Inter-Governmental Philatelic Corp. of New York, will distribute Silver Jubilee sets of 12 postal administrations, Antigua, Bahamas, Dominica, Gibraltar, Grenada and its Grenadines, Guernsey, Jersey, Maldives, St. Lucia, Seychelles and Togo. The sets will have two to five denominations and all except Guernsey and Jersey also will have souvenir sheets.

There will also be non-omnibus issues from the Isle of Man, Anguilla, St. Vincent and its Grenadines, Tonga, Tuvalu, Western Samoa and Cook Islands and its post offices in Aitutaki and Penryhn. St. Vincent will have the biggest of the Silver Jubilee issues, with one stamp showing a step in the coronation ceremony and 11 others picturing all of the rulers of England from the days of William the Conqueror, three or four to a stamp. There will also be a souvenir sheet with the 12 stamps and all 42 rulers.

Great Britain itself has announced a set of four stamps, but they will not be issued until May, to coincide with the nationwide Jubilee tour of the Queen starting that month. The four stamps will be on general sale at least until mid-June and supplies will be adequate for them to be on sale at places visited by the Queen until her tour ends in mid-August.

Canada will issue a single stamp, with the Queen's portrait, Australia two stamps with pictures of the Queen and the Queen with Prince Phillip taken on her last visit, and New Zealand plans of souvenir sheet with five different portraits of the Queen.



## Unhinged

Which of the 36 Commonwealth countries will not be issuing a commemorative stamp for the Queen's silver jubilee this year? The Crown Agents' stamp bureau has persuaded 24 member states and dependencies to take part in an omnibus issue with a common theme, and has word that several other nations, from Australia to Seychelles, will be producing their own designs.

But there is no word from India, Sri Lanka, Malaysia or Singapore, and the Crown Agents have doubts about Uganda. It is not just because those places have their own rulers: the Swaziland 20c commemorative shows the Queen casting a sidelong glance at the bearded head of King Sobhuza II, and the Gambia 50 butut shows the head of President Jaworski and no Queen at all.

Colin Freeman, marketing manager of the Crown Agents'

stamp bureau, at the launching of the omnibus issue on Tuesday night, said that it was an attempt to get away from previous Commonwealth commemorative issues, in which all the stamps were of identical design. This time the low-value stamps show a local connexion with Royalty—Prince Philip with a beard in Ascension, or the Queen knighting Gary Sobers in Barbados.

The designers obviously had a spot of bother with St Helena, local connexions with the Royal Family being sparse; the best they could do was a picture of the Royal visit of 1947, before the present reign even began. And on the New Hebrides Condominium 35 centimes the Queen is shown holding an umbrella, apparently to shield herself from the République Française monogram in the top corner.
